

and Kinah near the border of Edom (Josh 15:21). Therefore, Jagur could be found in the southernmost district of Judah, in the Negeb east of the Beersheba Valley. Since Kinah is usually identified with *Hirbet Ġazze* (1657.0686) along the *Wādī el-Qēnī* (165.065) south of Arad [*Tell 'Arād* (1621.0766)], Jagur should be identified with *Hirbet Sumrā* (1630.0710) lying between Arad and Kinah, and not with *Hirbet el-Garra* (1487.0711) or *Tell el-Milh* (1525.0696). Jagur is also mentioned on a fragmentary list of delivery at Arad underlining its proximity to Arad (AI 42). LXX<sup>B</sup> renders Jagur with Ασωο. Jerome translates Jagur with “colonist” or “stranger” (*Nom. hebr.* 28.8–9), but gives no information exceeding the biblical description (*Sit.* 107.22).

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## Jagur

Jagur (MT *Yāgūr*, “cairn”, “altar,” or “He resided”; LXX *λαγουο*) is a town in the tribal territory of Judah between Arad (LXX<sup>L</sup>; scribal error *'Eder* in MT)
